This month's Member Spotlight: Ann Stolinsky

Ann's most phenomenal publishing credit is a story published in March 2020 in Klarissa Dreams Redux, a charity anthology that had been selected to go to the moon in a time capsule with an organization called Writers on the Moon

(https://www.writersonthemoon.com/how-it-works). Unfortunately, the capsule rounded the moon but didn't land, instead, it burned up on reentry to the Earth. But this was an incredible honor.

Ann placed third in The Write Stuff conference's short fiction category in 2023. Ann's short stories and poems have appeared in approximately 30 anthologies and magazines, and a few online websites. Several of her short stories appear in Clarendon House anthologies, and have been published by Gallery of Curiosities, Tales from the Canyons of the Dead, and Night to Dawn magazine, among others. A poem was published in the Fall 2015 issue of Space & Time Magazine. Ann is a member of the GLVWG writer's cafe.

Gemini Wordsmiths formed a publishing imprint, Celestial Echo Press, www.celestialechopress.com, in May 2019. Their first anthology, The Twofer Compendium, was published in December 2019. Their second, The Trench Coat Chronicles, was published in December 2020. In 2021, Celestial Echo Press published TIME Blinked, a novel written by George W. Young. In 2022, they published DracuLAND, a novel also written by George W. Young. In 2023, they published Chasing Ashes, written by Joanne McLaughlin. They plan to publish more anthologies this year.



Write Stuff Conference News

OK, so this article is kind of technical, but there are features of the conference I want to make sure you can access: The Flash Lit Contest, advertising in the handout program, and the Saturday Book Fair.

Let's take the Flash Lit Contest first. There are three categories: fiction, non-fiction, and poetry. You can enter all three categories. Only registered Write Stuff attendees may submit. If you win, you get a \$10 gift certificate to the book fair happening around you when we announce the winners. The are door prizes for second and third places. Each entry must be 100 words or less. Next, let me talk about advertising in the handout program. Our ad sizes and prices are as follows:

Three ad sizes available:

1.5" x 4" \$30

2.5" x 4" - \$45

4" x 4" - \$60

Copy to be provided by advertiser in .jpg, or png graphic format, 300 dpi minimum resolution for clarity. Ad can be printed in color!

Also, we have one-liner advertisements. The one-line ad is another way of showing your support of the conference and letting people know of your service. The cost is \$10. The format is: Name Service Website/Contact Information (How to reach you.) Or you can use the one-liner to congratulate someone.

Last, and certainly not least, is the book fair. The 2024 Book Fair will be held on Saturday, April 13th, in the Lehigh Room, 4:00 pm to 5:30 pm. During this time, authors can sell their books directly, or through consignment with Book & Puppet. Your Book Fair Chairperson for 2024 is yours truly and you can reach me via email at glvwg.bookfair@gmail.com.

At this year's conference, Book & Puppet Co. will be set up in the Lehigh Room to make consignment sales. Authors who are part of the Book & Puppet GLVWG display in their store are automatically part of the book fair.

If you are a member of GLVWG and are not part of the Book & Puppet display, here is your chance. Send a request to me at glvwg.bookfair@gmail.com for a consignment form. Return the filled out consignment form, then bring two or three copies of your book(s) to the Lehigh Room between 11:30am and 2:00pm. Andy Laties of Book & Puppet will be there to receive your titles.

If you plan to sell on consignment: Book and Puppet will take a 30% commission. The advantage of this method is that since Book and Puppet will be conducting the sales, they can take credit cards, and you will be free to walk around the Book Fair and check out everyone else's books. All books in the book fair will be available at a 10% discount from list price. However, you will get 70% based on the list price of your book. If you plan on selling your books without consignment, you must reserve a spot. Email Charles Kiernan glvwg.bookfair@gmail.com. you are responsible for taking any unsold copies when leaving. Neither the Conference Committee nor the hotel is responsible for your books. If notification is not given, you will not be able to sell books.

The conference is once again having door prizes for those folks who fill out a Conference Evaluation form. Any books you've authored are welcome for the drawing. Please provide the copies to me. If I am unavailable, they can be dropped off at the registration desk.
